However it was disappointing that two of the groups had very low audience numbers as they had travelled a distance to perform and their productions were excellent. The standard of all six productions this year was very high. I enjoyed all six very much. Our adjudicator Ailbhe Garvey-Hughes had a difficult decision. In the end Balally Players were victorious with Ulster American. Their production went on to Athlone and won the Abbey Theatre Award.

5. Treasurer's Report

AUDF Treasurer's Report for the 2025 AGM.

The accounts for 1^{St} April 2024 to 31^{St} March 2025 are as distributed. Income for the year was £8,737.48. This was made up of Affiliation fees of £700 plus the income from festivals as detailed below. Outgoings were £11,994.46, leaving us with and overall loss on the year of £3,256.98.

The 2024 Ulster Drama Festival was helped financially by a grant from Enkalon, adverts and reasonable ticket sales. However, the overall loss for that event was £2,716.57.

The 1-Act Final January 2025 had an income of £2,890 from ticket sales plus £50 from an advert. Outgoings were £1,222.55 leaving a profit of £1,717.45.

The accounts details have been sent to Connor Moore, who is a Charity Commission auditor, to check and approve.

2025 Ulster Drama Festival - Also distributed is the summary for the 2025 Ulster Drama Festival held in April, which indicates a small profit of £791.42, thanks to grants from Enkalon, Drama Circle Theatre Trust, and Antrim & Newtownabbey Borough Council.

The balance at the end of the year was £6,425.54. Our current balance £5,915.03.

Just a gentle reminder that annual affiliation fees are now due. The rate for the last several years has been £100. It may be a time to discuss an increase.

Questions on Report -

The subscription to AUDF by festivals was raised from £60 to £100 last year, so another increase was not justified.

Mac Pollock asked about "Fees for Adjudicators" minimum fee from GODA is £90 and ADA fee is 160 Euro which relates to £140. It was agreed the secretary should contact GODA and check how is eligible for the £90 and confirm their website details are correct, before contacting ADA.

Ballymoney Drama Festival:

1st- 8th March Nancy Heath Open Winner – "The Night Alive" Slemish Players

I cannot begin this report without a reminder of the death of Barbara Cooke, former Chair and Minute Secretary of AUDF, who had been a member of Ballymoney Drama Festival Committee since 1984. She first won the award for Best Actress at Ballymoney Festival in 1979 and she made a significant contribution to the success of the Festival, on stage and off, for nearly half a century. She enjoyed success with Ballymoney Literary and Debating Society as an actor and a director, and her work won her the respect and admiration of the Amateur Drama Community in Northen Ireland and beyond. She will be sadly missed by us all and we continue to offer our sympathy and support to her sister, Gail Morrow, who is also a member of the Ballymoney Committee.

The 84th Ballymoney Drama Festival ran from Monday 3rd to Saturday 7th March 2025. The adjudicator was Nancy Heath, who was making her first visit to Ballymoney – we would be happy to welcome her back in the future. On the Final Night, cups and trophies were presented by Clare Greer, Chair of AUDF.

There were only four entries this year. Slemish Players were awarded first place for their production of *The Night Alive* by Conor McPherson, Rosemary came second with *Can You Ever Forgive Me?* By Ian McDonald and Bart's production of *The Whiteheaded Boy* came third. Our fourth entry was from Theatre 3 and Belvoir Players generously agreed to perform their One Act play. *The Little Box of Oblivion*, on what was our fifth and final night.

With no production by a local company and no obviously 'popular 'play to attract a larger than average audience, our Box Office returns have suffered because of this smaller entry. I am sure other Festivals share our concerns about this situation but perhaps it is a particularly acute problem in Ballymoney as we are only affiliated to AUDF. For now, we can only hope we will see more of the 'usual' teams back on the circuit next year.

We plan to run again next year from Friday 27th to Saturday 7th March. Our Adjudicator will be Tristan Marshall.
